SESSION met February 15th. We met by zoom (another meeting by zoom—what a winter!). Following are actions and reports of the meeting. Melanie was elected Clerk, pro tem.

<u>Pastor's Report</u> for January: Total hours were 58. Approximately 13 hours per week. This included: Sunday Worship Service x 5, Sunday Service & Sermon Preparation x 4, includes Power Points and Bulletins, Sunday School x 4, Session Meeting, Cluster Meeting. Emails/texts/phone calls with parishioners. The numbers don't match because January 1st was a Sunday, and the preparation for that happened in December. Little preparation for the first Sunday in February was done in January, so that was not counted in the preparation number. January 15 was Zoom only, so there was no Sunday School.

<u>BUILDING & GROUNDS:</u> Jerry Brown & Judy Norton Integrity Plumbing and Heating has replaced the thermostat in the sanctuary. They will check the furnace next to try to solve the problem of proper temperature for the sanctuary.

The Manse was totally stripped with the living room walls washed to improve the smell. The doors, kitchen sink and bathtub were removed by crew and the Gem Village antique store (church was paid a bit by the antique store). **There are kitchen appliances free for the taking, if you know of someone with the need.** The crew of Bud, Lance, Louis, Lisa and Judy spent three days cleaning, tearing down and sweeping. Samples of the insulation and drywall are being tested before Jim Sawyer moves forward. Judy asks that we keep this project in our prayers that God will be with us and the workers doing the remodel that we may glorify God in all that is being done. Continuing prayers that God will supply the funds needed to complete the project.
